**CONTINUED FRIGID TEMPERATURES MAKE HOMELESSNESS EVEN MORE CHALLENGING**  
**No one will be turned away from sheltering from the cold**

ORLANDO, FL – (January 27, 2022) – As the deep south, including the City Beautiful, experiences another arctic system this weekend, The Salvation Army Orlando Area Command is preparing for additional people seeking shelter from the freeze. While we are still following our downsized COVID capacity, we will not turn anyone away this weekend who find their way to our doors.

The Salvation Army Men’s Shelter is located at 624 Lexington Ave and the Women’s & Children’s Shelter is located at 400 West Colonial Drive. Check in at both is 4:30pm nightly. No matter the circumstances, no matter the weather, we are here to serve those needing emergency shelter and assistance to transition from homelessness to stable housing.

For those not seeking shelter but in need of a meal, our soup kitchen provides a daily meal, served out of our Men’s Shelter, from 3:30pm – 4:30pm 365 days a year. For additional information regarding shelter and social services, those needing support can call our offices at 407.423.8581.

We are grateful to our donors who generously provide blankets, coats, and socks at this time of year.
